EQUINE EXTRAVAGANZA, MUFFY SEATON CLINIC

I missed the Leyland Farm Drive since I had signed up to take the Muffy Seaton Clinic at the Equine Extravaganza. I almost had to cancel that, since Precious had her feet trimmed on Monday then on Thursday we went to Latta Plantation to ride and she got sore feet from having her soles trimmed to much. After a day of rest on pasture and a dose of bute she was fine so we headed for Raleigh at 8:00 am for a clinic at 1:15pm.

I had the very exciting feat of backing the rig up along a fence so I could keep it near the porta pen she was going to be in all day! After what seemed like an hour of backing and a ton of sweat we were parked. Marilyn Colvin helped me get Precious settled and we went in to watch a very interesting Lynn Plam Clinic. We meandered through the venders and I found a Carriage Vendor....it was Muffy Seaton's booth. I was introduced to her and we talked a bit

about what was going to happen in the clinic. At 12:45 we went back to get Precious ready and I found I had to pull the trailer forward since some kind soul parked RIGHT BEHIND the trailer, I could get the door open but couldn't get the carriage off!

Precious was absolutely wonderful driving up the side road with all the vehicles and pedestrians she had to pass. She got a little nervous when they had to move a chain link gate to let us through to go into the Dorton arena, but did herself proud and didn't spook. I do believe I was more nervous than she was until we got in the arena, then she got stiff as a board and wouldn't travel in a straight line, she was constantly looking to the outside of the circles we were making and didn't want to slow down. I guess Muffy was really able to tell how much Precious needed to learn how to bend! While Muffy was giving her opening talk we just kept driving around, Precious really didn't like the fans at one end of the arena, but I sure appreciated them! When Muffy was ready I had to unhitch, but leave the saddle & breeching on and put an open bridle on her with the driving reins through the tugs. Of course after I thought we were ready Muffy wanted the driving bit on that bridle. By the time we were ready the sweat was running off of me and my glasses kept fogging up, my hair (after removing my helmet) looked like I must have just washed it, it was so wet!

Muffy then took over and (TRIED) to long line Precious, she was all over the place trying to back up not going in a straight line, not necessarily resisting, but not knowing what was expected of her. Muffy wanted her to balance herself in the turns, Precious "falls in" on turns (putting all her weight on the inside). It didn't take long though and Muffy had her walking around the arena where she was being directed by Muffy, with her weight on the outside. Then Muffy added a side pass (bending to the right). You could really see the difference in the way Precious was moving now.

Muffy explained where the withers go the carriage will go, if you control the withers you control the carriage. If the horses head is facing left the withers are automatically going to go right and that is where the carriage will go too. In order to get Precious to bend, I was supposed to use half halts with my outside (right) rein when the left leg was in the air and my left rein was "Closing the Door" to make her shoulder go to the right. Precious was "Falling in" because she was putting all her weight to the inside when it needed to be on the outside so that she could "free up the inside leg to move it up under her body to support her weight" Of course I was trying so hard to concentrate on my hands I would forget to watch the hind legs and would get myself mixed up or vice versa. Muffy then had me doing short stretches (maybe four or five steps) going sideways while bent. We accomplished this by my moving to the right from behind her and using the same half halts on the outside rein while the inside leg was in the air. I think Precious learned much more than I did, I need to work on following her rhythm and my coordination!

We had no time to hitch her back up to leave the arena, so Marilyn lead Precious out as they were bringing in the drag harrow (so considerate of the driver)! I hauled the carriage and loose pieces of tack back to the trailer...at least it was down hill! Precious looked like I felt, she was sopping wet. After hosing her down I ran the hose over my head to cool down too, we settled Precious back in the porta stall with fresh water then went in and had lunch and did our shopping. I would like to thank Marilyn and Gail Carter who assisted me in the arena with unhitching Precious and to Marilyn for bringing that extra water for me to drink!


